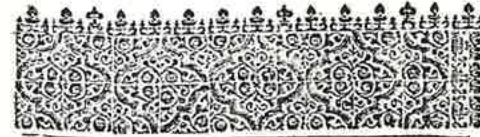

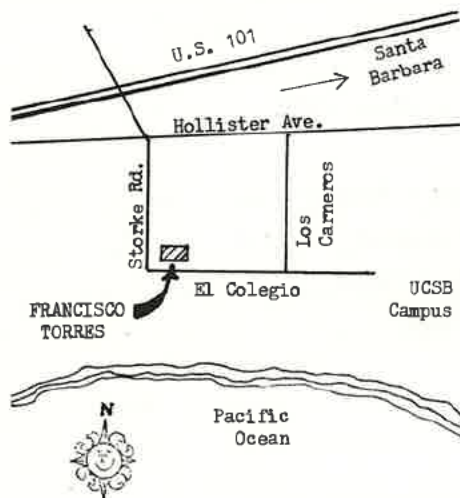

CONFERENCE INFORMATION

The Pacific Coast Conference on British Studies meeting will be held at the Francisco Torres Conference Center, 6850 El Colegio Road, Goleta, Ca., 93017. Registration and reservations should be made through the chairman for local arrangements, J. Sears McGee, Department of History, UCSB, 93106 -- telephone: (805) 961 3635. If he cannot be reached by telephone, messages may be left for him with the History Department office, 961-2991.



Francisco Torres is located approximately eleven miles from Santa Barbara. If you are coming from the south, continue on 101 (North) through the city until you reach the Storke Rd./Glen Annie exit. Turn left at the top of the offramp and continue to the end of Storke Road. The two high-rise towers can be seen from the freeway. Coming from the north, reverse these directions -- as indicated on the map.

If you will be arriving by plane, bus or train, state your time and place of arrival on the registration form (or by phone or

letter no later than Tuesday, April 1); we will arrange to have you met and driven to the conference.

Room rates at Francisco Torres are as follows: \$8.25 per person per night (double occupancy for two bedrooms, sharing a bath); \$11.75 (per person; double occupancy with bath); \$23.50 (for single with bath). If you have a preference for a roommate(s), please indicate name(s). If not, Francisco Torres will place you with others according to the rate indicated on your registration form.



Children under two are free (including meals). For children under six, meals are \$1.50. Francisco Torres does not have rollaway beds but parents may bring sleeping bags and use them for children without charge. If the child occupies a bed, the rate is the same as for an adult. Tennis courts and pool are available; the beach or the mountains are within a short drive.

For those who wish to stay elsewhere, the following motels are within a short drive: Holiday Inn (Patterson or Fairview offramp, 964-6241); Hollister Inn (Fairview offramp, 967-5591); Howard Johnson Motor Inn (Turnpike offramp, 964-3511); Motel 6 (Patterson or Fairview offramp, 964-1812).

Registration fees and prices of meals will be found on the registration form. The form is on the inside back cover of this brochure--it must be returned by Monday, March 24. The UCSB History Department is hosting a continental breakfast on Saturday morning and would be grateful if you would indicate whether you plan to attend. If you prefer to take a full breakfast in the cafeteria, the cost is \$1.90. The banquet on Friday evening at the UCSB Faculty Club offers the following menu: green salad, New York cut roast sirloin of beef, Yorkshire pudding, au gratin potatoes, green beans, dessert and wine.
